Performing/Producing: During my undergraduate, graduate studies, and as a professor, I produced and performed in concerts, workshops, and small festivals with students and visiting artists. While pursuing graduate degrees, I performed in a variety of states and in international tours singing in a renown composer's ensemble My field work residency was in Greece, and I later toured as a road manager for a singer in Europe, Asia and the U.S.

Teaching: While a professor in Michigan, my students and I performed in concerts, organized special events, and played in local venues. Over time I've been an instructor from grade school to university level, from a variety of educational institutions to many community arts programs. I won small grants for a program in integrated arts and music-related educational projects. I've long been an arts advocate. public speaker and freelance journalist on Music, Culture and the Arts.

Bandleader: My 5-voice vocal jazz group in Los Angeles, Borrowed Time, grew to be one of the most respected Vocal Jazz groups in LA for over 10 years. I wrote the bulk of Borrowed Time's lyrics and arrangements of works by major jazz composers. After relocating to Arizona from L.A., I opened my private voice studio over 15 years ago. I perform occasionally with my own ensembles, "JJJazz," in duos to larger groups in Tucson, where the studio is based.
